Dear Friends,

I hope you are all remaining well. This is a brief update of where we are as a church as we enter the season of summer holidays.

Church Reopening

I am pleased to say that the church reopened for private worship on Sunday July 26th with 25 worshippers which was very encouraging. For the next few weeks into mid-September we will be offering a Service of the Word at 9:00 am, whilst continuing with our online service. This has now moved to 10:30 a.m. as some people like to do both. We are not opening during the week yet, but will continue to keep things under review as we proceed with Sundays.

We have made strenuous efforts to make the church Covid -19 secure. This obviously changes the manner in which we worship, but God is wherever we choose to connect with Him, and the manner in which we do so makes no difference.

All we need is a sincere heart and desire to worship, and it is done.

There is hand gel at the door, and we are recording people's names and numbers for the purposes of Track and Trace. This data is held securely and disposed of after 21 days. We have been asked to encourage the use of face coverings, and a small supply is available at the door should you forget to bring our own.

Inside we have a one-way system and socially distanced seating, which makes sure that worship is safe. We have no singing, refreshments or eucharist at the moment, so associated risks with those things are removed,

The service is approximately 30 minutes long comprising some musical reflection, readings and a short sermon and prayers. If public transport is off putting, and you are able to drive, it is possible for some to park for free until 10:00 a.m. in the service road opposite the church near the gym. The church toilets are not in use yet, and we will see if we can change that in due course.

By mid-September we hope to offer a eucharist, an online service, and a return to hosting the London Chinese Church alliance who normally share our building, all subject to experience, and guidelines.

Finances

St John's relies on the generosity of its congregation. However, lockdown has obviously affected our income because although many donate by standing order, a number of you use donation envelopes. Because donating by envelope has not been possible, our income has dropped over the closure period. So, if you can switch to standing order and donate automatically though your bank, you would be doing us an

enormous blessing. On the other hand, if you have been putting your financial support in envelopes, it would be great if you can let us have them, so that we can bank the money.

As ever, huge thanks for your generous support in keeping the gospel alive in the centre of Harrow. God go with you and your families.
